No. The determination was made based on the impact of traffic counts, and the streets have enough capacity, except at the intersections.

Grant applications are due this summer with availability beginning 2023-2024. We are anticipating a 16-month construction duration. The 27 Shepherd is a frequent bus route with 60+ trips per day in each direction and hundreds of boardings in the potential project area. Please consider consolidating bus stops and moving them to the far side of the intersection to expedite bus service. Also consider transit signal priority and upgrade bus stop infrastructure (shelter, lighting, information, raised boarding platforms) to provide a pleasant transit experience. Sidewalks should be 8 feet wide. Option 3 is best for minimizing bus/bike conflicts. I strongly support the reductions in lanes.	Thank you for your comment. 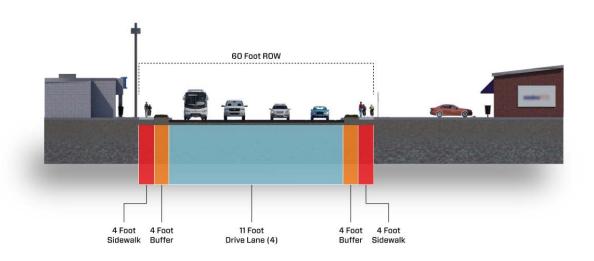


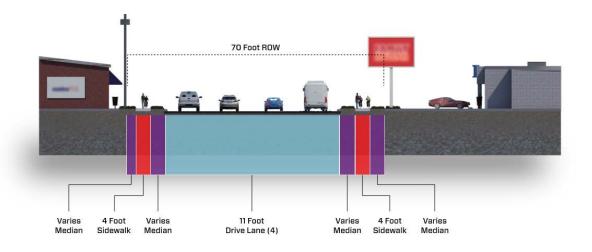


Cross Sections Existing

SHEPHERD DRIVE (EXISTING)



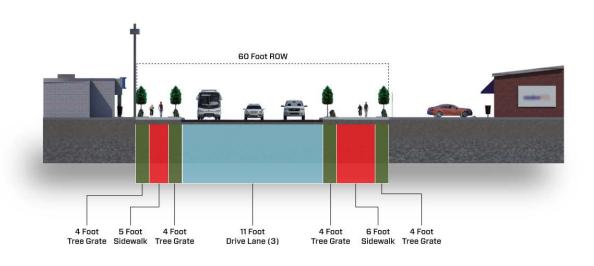


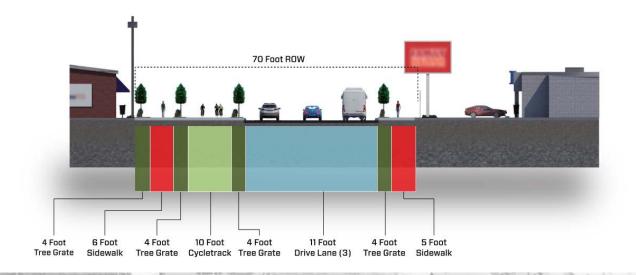


Cross Section Concepts

SHEPHERD DRIVE (OPTION 1)



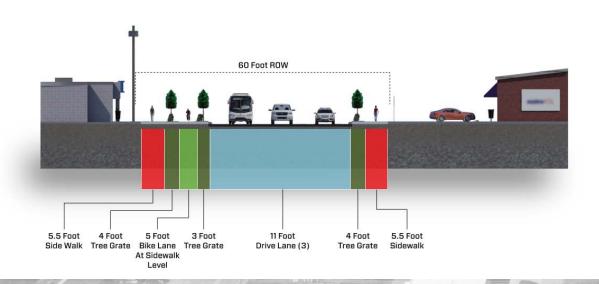


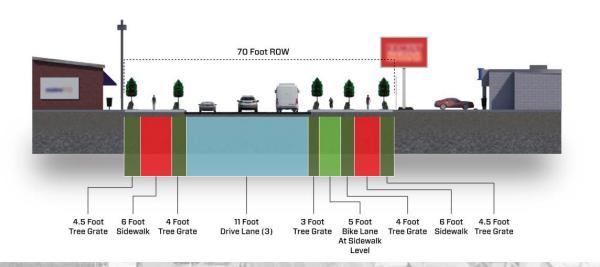
